In order to be consistent and fair to all builders in our community and speed up the approval process, the Architectural Committee will require the following documents be submitted to the Chairperson:


- 1. Clear drawing of placement of proposed home on the lot, showing dimensions and setbacks.
- Elevation drawing that shows height above ground level.

 A statement that before delivery to the customer, the builder will install a culvert in the swale at the road to prevent backing up water on others' properties. The recent heavy rains have demonstrated that this is a requirement.

The Island Theatre, site of the 1961 world premier of "Misty of Chincoteague", has been welcoming box office visitors with Misty's own hoof prints for more than 5 decades.

Since 2011, under the ownership of the Chincoteague Island Arts Organization (CIAO), a 501(c) (3) Non-Profit, the theatre has undergone floor-to-roof repairs. Generous donations from individuals, groups in the community and grants have also made digital technology a reality..This makes the Island Theatre one of the only digital movie theatres between Cape Charles and Salisbury.

CIAO's goal is to create a performing arts center that will show first run movies throughout the year, as well as host concerts, live theater and other community and cultural events. Renovations and upgrades still needed makes ongoing fundraising a necessity. The old theatre seats, currently for sale, offer individuals a chance to own a piece of island history, while contributing to the theatre's future.

Filling the seats will be a given when, Wednesday, December 31st at 8pm, CIAO will present the 3rd annual New Year's Eve concert at the Island Theatre. Bill Toms brings creativity, power, and passion to his audiences through his repertoire of rhythm and blues, soul, folk, and rock and roll. He has opened for and played with a long

and impressive list of notables, such as The Band, Bob Dylan, Bruce Springsteen, Little Feat, and Stevie Ray Vaughan. A sold out event last year had guests dancing in the aisles to Bill and his band, Hard Rain, and this year promises to be a reprise. Snowy Forecast This Winter ...

Three "snowy" bird breeds from the arctic may be seen around Chincoteague during the winter season. They are Snow Geese, Snow Buntings and Snowy Owls.



The Snow Goose is a North American species that summers and breeds in the arctic. Fields of the eastern shore and the impoundments of the Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge provide perfect habitat and food for the wintering flocks. Large flocks of these white and black geese are easily recognized as they move overhead and then swirl down to rest and feed. You may also note some darker 'blue phase' subspecies mixed in with the flock.

The Snow Bunting is a small song bird that has white wings and black wing tips. The Snow Bunting is an arctic species that migrates south for the winter. The eastern shore of Virginia is about the southern bounds of the Snow Bunting's



range. These birds are typically seen in small flocks around the beach or in farm fields. A flock of four was seen on November 16th in the parking lot next to the Tom's Cove Visitor Center on Assateague.



The Snowy Owl is unusual for the area. A lack of this Owl's food (lemmings) in the more northern winter grounds last winter caused a rarely seen eruption of this bird south to Florida. Bird experts believe that a similar eruption could also occur this winter. The Snowy Owl is about two feet high with a five foot wing span. They have been

seen in the dunes at the beach and on stands out in the water. One was even spotted on our own Main Street on top of a street light.

So keep your eyes open this winter for avian forms of snow.
