New To The Neighborhood ...

Welcome to Jacqueline Ann Nuzzo and Tracey Denes who moved into their new home at 272 Pine Tree Way. And, new home construction is underway on Lots #259 and #295/#295A, bringing the total number of homes in the community to 45.

Updates From The Board ...

The OB II POA Board of Directors met on March 14th to determine priorities for 2015 and beyond. For the current year, there are plans to:

- Complete clearing and grading around the community entrance pond.
- Clear in front of Mallard Pond near the end of N. Hibiscus Drive.
- Complete the cul-de-sac on Lakeview Road.
- Remove down/dead trees from several common area locations.

The Board considers restoring the community drainage system to alleviate flooding in the community as a top priority. An expert in environmental restoration is working to determine county requirements and provide an initial estimate for the work required. Look for a further update next month.

The Board is aware of Southern Pine Beetle infestation that is damaging and killing many of the Loblolly Pine Trees in the community. The Board is working to determine if a cost effective method exists to prevent or exterminate the Beetles.

Butter Butts At The Beach ...

April is the time of year when the spring songbird migration really cranks up. Among the many species passing through on their way north for the breeding season are 30+different species of warblers. Warblers are small insect eating birds which generally have a warbling or trilling type of song.

One of the most abundant and easy to identify is the Yellow-rumped Warbler, aka butter butt. Yellow-rumps can be readily seen in the community and at the wildlife refuge most of the year, summer being the exception.

Yellow-rumped warblers are about 5 inches long and have diagnostic yellow patches on the outer breast and, of course, a yellow rump. The males are much more colorful than the females. However, both will show the diagnostic patches. Yellow-rumps can be seen gleaning insects off of trees, shrubs and even the ground. They have adapted over time to lack of food sources during certain times of the year and also consume berries from Crepe Myrtles. For this reason, they are also known as the Myrtle Warbler.

Back to the spring migration. As noted, there are 30+ Warbler species that might be seen or heard during April and May. If you have a bird guide, you can likely identify a number of the more common migrants by sight or sound. Identification can be very confusing as the birds are moving a lot of the time and they may be up in a tree that has begun to sprout leaves.

In past years, Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge has been fortunate to have a volunteer bird bander during migration. Richard Roberts is a retired biochemist who spends many hours every year studying birds. You might see him banding birds at the entry road to the Woodland Trail or by the Tom's Cove Visitors Center. Mr. Roberts puts up mist nets that the birds get caught in. He will remove each bird from the net, collect vital information (size, weight, sex, age), band the bird and set it free. The band numbers are entered into a database that allows tracking the birds if they are found in the future. Mr. Roberts is always happy to share what he is doing and allow you close-up views of what he is banding. It's always an education talking to him. So, I'd encourage you to stop by and say hi if you see him out banding.

Bird migration habits are an interesting subject. By April, waterfowl have headed north and are beginning to breed. In May, the shorebirds will be heading north for their breeding season. Enjoy the spring migration and keep an eye out for those butter butts.
