### Extra, Extra, Read All About It ...

The 40th annual joint meeting of the Oyster Bay II Community Property Owners Association, Inc. and the Oyster Bay II Water & Sewer Company, Inc. was held on Saturday, October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2015 at Hampton Inn & Suites. It was attended by 34 members of the Association and the Secretary accepted 17 proxies. It was good to see so many new owners in attendance. Meeting highlights include:

- Fees for POA members and the Water & Sewer Company customers will remain the same for 2016.
- The project to restore the community drainage system has begun with an end date planned for November 2015.
- Discussing the use of barley straw as a means of controlling algae growth on Mallard Pond.
- Board approved moving forward with a community website. It should be on-line by the end of 2015.
- Board is looking at solutions to OB II's road related problems, including fixing pot holes to preclude damage to vehicles; installing speed bumps to help slow down traffic; and examining ways to extend the life of the roads versus waiting 20 years for the community to complete build out.
- Access to "Parcel E" abutting N. Hibiscus Dr. at the Community entrance off of Main St. continues to be an issue. Association members unanimously voted to not allow access through the OB II community. The POA will be kept informed of any future developments.

### Like a Good Neighbor ...

Reminder that Article VI of the Town Code requires developed lots to maintain grass at no more than 10 inches high. The same applies to undeveloped lots for a distance of 5 feet in from any adjacent developed property. In other words, if you have not built on your lot, but your neighbor has, you have an obligation to keep 5 feet of your lot maintained along the common property line. Contact the Town if you have questions.

### **Building Requirements ...**

The Association Covenants and Restrictions require Architectural Committee approval for most improvements made to your property. This includes new home, exterior renovations, sheds, etc. If you are not sure, ask an architectural committee member for guidance.



### What's Cooking ...

An apple a day keeps the doctor away and this recipe may keep you close to the kitchen when it's ready to enjoy.

### **German Raw Apple Cake**

- ½ cup shortening
- ½ cup brown sugar
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 1/4 cups flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1 cup buttermilk



### Topping:

- ½ cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- ½ cup chopped pecans
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

Bake at 350° until a toothpick comes out clean, approximately 30 minutes.

One potato, two potato, three potato, four. Try this recipe and you'll like potatoes even more! Thank you Judy Frey for sharing both of these recipes with all of us.

### **Creamy Potato Soup**

- 3 tablespoons butter
- 1 onion, diced
- · 4 large potatoes, cubed
- 3 tablespoons parsley, chopped
- · 3 stalks celery, chopped
- 2 large carrots, chopped
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika
- 1 ½ cups boiling water

Sauté onion in butter until tender. Add remaining ingredients except white sauce and cook until vegetables are tender. Add white sauce and stir until blended.

#### White Sauce:

- 2 cups milk
- 2 cups heavy cream
- 2 heaping tablespoons flour
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 2 chicken bouillon cubes
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper

Mix ½ cup milk with flour. Stir to get any lumps out. Heat remaining milk and cream and bring to boil. Add flour mixture and stir constantly until thickened. Add remaining ingredients. Stir until bouillon cubes are dissolved.

This soup reheats nicely!
