Updates from the Board ...

The 41st annual meeting of the Oyster Bay II Community Property Owners Association, Inc. and the annual meeting of the Oyster Bay II Water & Sewer Co., Inc. was held on Sat, Oct.22nd. Important topics were discussed, including:

The Board is working to fill the void left by the passing of our treasurer, Karen Frank. Each committee reported out on progress achieved through the year. A proposal for a revision to the Association's Covenants & Restrictions was brought to a vote, with all in attendance approving the revision. A voting ballot has been sent to those not represented at the meeting for the purpose of obtaining 2/3 majority required to approve the revision. POA 2017 fees have been set at \$260 for unimproved lots and \$335 for improved lots. All members of the current Board were elected to serve the 2017 term.

Highlights from the Annual Meeting of the Oyster Bay II Water & Sewer Company included a history of the corporation and the plan forward for management of the company by a separate Board. Recent costly repairs at the

sewer plant including, replacement of the filter media and a pump were completed during the summer. The repairs have been effective and the hope is for quiet operations in 2017. Customer usage rate for 2017 has been set at \$160/qtr. The first independent Board of Directors for the 2017 term was elected. The Board intends to meet prior to 2017 to elect officers and set the agenda moving forward.

Feeding Frenzy on Mallard Lake By Andy Suchoski

As the summer wanes and the algae on Mallard Lake begins to die, a strong wind will churn up the lake and apparently create an abundant food supply for shore birds. We've had our home on Mallard Lake for six years now and in late August or September we've seen this event occur every year; sometimes multiple times.

The wind from tropical storm Hermine caused this situation to occur in early September. Hundreds of egrets, heron and ibis flocked to the shores of the lake while sea gulls gathered on the surface of the lake looking for food. There were also a half dozen cormorants diving in the lake. The event is also very loud with the guttural squawking of the heron and egrets and cackling of the sea gulls. The frenzy starts when the sun comes up and continues for several hours. Later in the morning the gulls fly off and the rest of the birds retreat to branches on the trees bordering the lake. Eventually everybody leaves and returns the next day. The gathering usually lasts for 3 or 4 days and then the lake is quiet again. It is a wonderful sight to behold.



How Did Chincoteague Get Its Name? By Kurt Jarvis

In 1760 a small settlement came to what is now Chincoteague then called just "the first island." The first winter was exceptionally cold and the settlers fashioned long cloaks out of spun horse hair down to their feet. However, socks where not made yet and while they had leather boots their shins were always getting frostbite.

One settler came up with a frostbite preventative by using discarded tea leaves compressed into thick cardboard like sections and tying these around their ankles and shins. These became known as "Shin co-coverings of tea to keep warm" shortened to "chin co tea k" and that is how Chincoteague got its name, not this nonsense of it being an Indian name.

Now ... As to how Assateague got its name, well, that's a yarn for a different telling!
